## 1) Plant and maintain a garden that includes four different crops.

Crops must include ONE type of flower and THREE different categories of vegetables. Crops can be grown in pots or directly in soil.

Flowers: any type planted from seed, minimum 3 plants.

<u>Vegetables</u>: any 3 different types, planted from seed. Types can include but are not limited to: root vegetables (i.e. carrots or beets, minimum 30 cm row), leafy vegetables (i.e. lettuce or kale, minimum 3 plants), legumes (i.e. beans or peas, minimum 3 plants), cucurbits (i.e. cucumber, squash, pumpkin, 1 plant).

## 2) Keep a simple one-page journal of your garden that includes:

Crops and varieties grown (i.e. radishes, variety Cherry Belle) Seeding and harvest dates of your crops

Garden maintenance routine

Describe any challenges or pests that you encountered

3) Photograph your garden <u>three</u> times during the growing season and include the photographs in your journal.

Photograph 1: One month after planting

Photograph 2: Mid-season

Photograph 3: Photograph vegetable crops when they are mature and when flowers are in blossom.

4) Create a "Welcome to our Garden" sign. Can be made of paper or other material.
